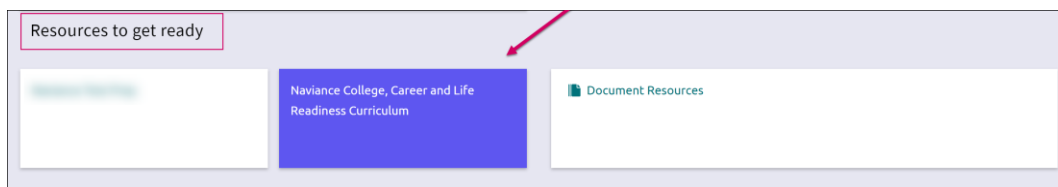

Lessons are broken up into 6 main categories:

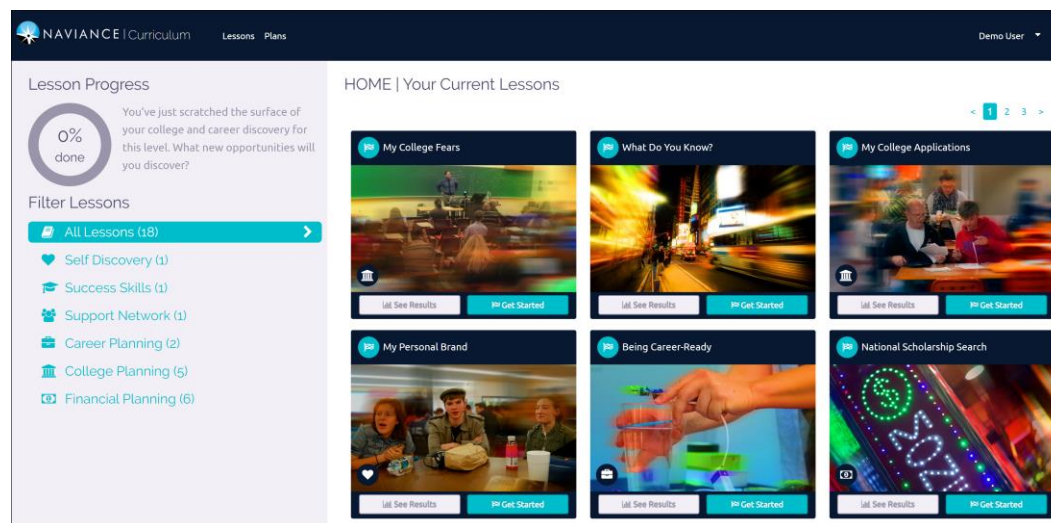
-  Self-Discovery

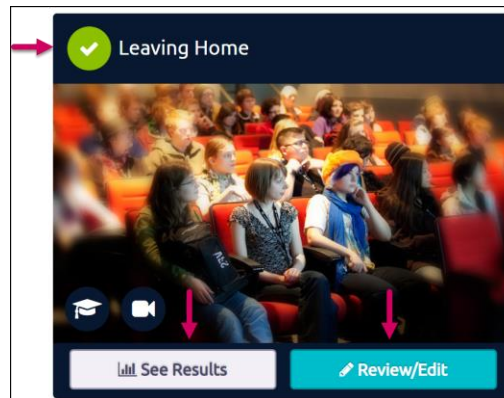
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Completing a Lesson

Once you are on the last page of the lesson, you will see the option to turn in your work. Make this selection when you are finished.



1. After you have selected **Turn In My Work**, you are returned to the menu of lessons.
2. Lessons you have completed will update like this:



- **Green Checkmark:** the lesson has been completed.
- **Review/Edit:** look at the lesson again or change an answer/response.
- **See Results:** shows an overview of your response to questions. To exit the results page, select the Naviance Curriculum logo.

Following Through on your Plans

Some lessons include a step in which you create a plan to act on something related to the lesson. How do you keep track of those plans and mark them as completed?

1. From the Naviance Curriculum home page, select **Plans** from the left corner.

From this page, you can see and search for any action items you have to complete. Once you have completed an action item, use the **blue check box next to the action to complete it.**

Once it is completed, the progress bar at the top of the page will reflect your level of completion.

Select **Lessons** to return to the Naviance Curriculum home page.
